Elevating Civics

AS A

National Priority

The [National Civics Bee](#)[®] has engaged nearly 20,000 students across more than 200 communities in 40 states to close the civic knowledge gap. In 2025, the Foundation announced that all 50 states, Washington, D.C., and American Samoa will participate in the competition.

We launched [Civics Academy](#) to extend civic learning beyond the classroom, engaging more than 175 employees across 41 organizations who then put their knowledge into practice through a [Civic Day of Action](#) in their local communities.

Connecting ^{THE} Military Community AND Employers

In 2025, our [Small Business Grant Program](#) awarded five \$10,000 grants to veteran- and military spouse-owned businesses, selected from more than 1,250 applicants, to support the growth of their enterprises and the communities they serve.

We launched the [Skilled Trades Academy](#), with support from the Lowe's Foundation, to prepare transitioning service members for high-demand careers in construction and skilled trades. We also introduced [Resume Engine 3.0](#), part of our innovative suite of [digital tools](#), to translate military service into civilian resumes in minutes.

Bolstering America's Resilience

We partnered with Google and the U.S. Chamber to launch [Small Business B\(AI\)sics](#)—a national initiative to equip 40,000 small businesses with practical artificial intelligence (AI) skills.

Our resilience report, [Beyond the Payoff](#), with Allstate and the U.S. Chamber, found that every \$1 not invested in disaster resilience today can cost communities up to \$33 in lost future economic activity.

We launched the [Solutions Bank](#), an AI-powered platform that curates clear, actionable solutions to help businesses drive positive impact. Our first pilot-focused on childcare solutions.

Through our [Global Threats Initiative](#), we brought government and industry together to confront 21st-century threats through public-private leadership. Our reports highlighted the [growing urgency](#) of geopolitical risk and how businesses can [manage](#) such risk.
